The Chairman wished everyone a good evening and welcomed them.

### **1. FIRE EVACUATION PROCEDURE**

Apologies for absence were received from Cllr Ackland who had a Pantomime rehearsal, Cllr Coleman who did not give a reason and the Police.

### **4. TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE ORDINARY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING ON 4 OCTOBER 2011**

**It was proposed by Cllr Keeling, seconded by Cllr Wyvern Batt and unanimously resolved that the minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 4 October 2011, with one amendment, be signed as a true and correct record.** The amendment was on Page 80/11, item 11. Footpaths, second sentence – the footpath number, 35, where the accident occurred should be added.

### **5. CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS**

The Chairman was suffering from a chest infection apologised that he was unwell.

### **6. POLICE REPORT**

**a) To receive and discuss any police report received and other police matters**

PCSO Ceri Sadler had sent her apologies for being unable to attend the meeting. She had provided a report that the Clerk read out:

'There have been six crimes reported to the Police for the month of October.

'These consist of two Burglaries in Praa Sands; a case of Misuse of the Communication Act 2003, also in Praa Sands; and a Common Assault in Godolphin. These are currently being investigated.

'The final crime is The Possession of Drugs in Breage and the offender has been dealt with accordingly.

'This compares to the same amount of crimes reported this time last year.

'Please do not hesitate to contact the Police if you see anything suspicious in your Parish.'

## 7. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

**Members of the public may raise subjects they wish to bring to the attention of the Parish Council. Listeners should note that decisions cannot be made on items not on the agenda.**

Public Participation was held here from 7.06 to 7.07 p.m.

## 8. REPORT FROM CORNWALL COUNCILLOR

Cllr Keeling gave the following report:

'An interesting month with a mixture of strategic briefings and local matters including a briefing by the NHS on establishing trauma networks in the southwest. The survival of badly injured victims is very much dependant on how rapidly treatment can be given and the availability of trained staff; from the paramedics on the ground to the specialists making an early diagnosis of a patient's condition. It is vital that trauma patients have access to the best and most effective treatment and as fast as possible to ensure not only survival but also that quality of life is preserved. In financial terms, of course, a fully recovered trauma victim is able to continue to lead a normal life; whilst without early intervention and effective trauma treatment the possible aftercare of a patient can be very costly indeed to the tax payer.

'Of course Cornwall Council is now considering its provisional budget for 2012/13 given that we are in a strong position to set the budget without the need to make further saving over those already proposed. The council was the first local authorities in the UK to set its budget at the end of last year. That decision means we are on track to achieve savings of around £88.5 million during 2011/12 at the same time as protecting services from the impact of government spending cuts. We are in a better position now to deal with any further reductions in government funding and also mean the authority has been able to look at opportunities for investing in key projects to deliver jobs and economic growth. The provisional budget sets out a number of key recommendations designed to support essential services and provide funding for areas of growth to help boost the Cornish economy.

'An additional £14.4m for Adult Social Care and Support, £700,000 to fund an educational maintenance allowance replacement scheme for students in Cornwall, Capital Funding to support projects such as detrunking of the Highways Agency controlled roads in Cornwall which could allow the dualling of the A30 at Temple and improvements to A38 accident black spots; the Port of Falmouth Master plan and a housing strategy to address local housing shortages.

£365,000 to support the voluntary sector;

'Of course the provisional budget will be scrutinised by members of our scrutiny committee before being brought before the full Council for decision on 29<sup>th</sup> November.

'Following the completion of the final report stage debates the government has committed to look again at several areas of the **Localism Bill** including standards and neighbourhood planning and will be presenting its amendments at the Third Reading which is due to take place in the House of Lords on 31<sup>st</sup> October

'I attended a meeting at Keneggy Sands to view and ascertain the liability of retaining the ramp, steps and chain ladder for egress from the beach. There are a number of safety issues associated with the structure including: the lower chain ladder fixing has come away from the rock face; the ladder is unstable and prone to twisting. The first platform is unstable and showed a great deal of movement when under load, ramp leading from the metal steps to the narrow footpath are slippery and the wooden slats are worn too far apart and one had a temporary fixing with wire. The structure is not meant to provide access to the beach; however, various websites and beach guides across Cornwall advise access to the beach can be made via metal ladders. The liability issues posed by the structure are numerous and should a member of the public suffer injury or loss due to defects on the structure the council may be held legally liable and have to pay out compensation which could run into £100K's. There also problems with the stability of the cliff face over the next 5 years. Removal of the structure would be the best outcome.

'There is a special Cornwall Conversations budget event especially for Town and Parish Councils at New County Hall, Truro, on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> November, 6pm-8pm. You are invited to come along and meet with our Leader of the Council Alec Robertson and Chief Executive Kevin Lavery, along with John Keeling the Chairman of our Corporate Resources Overview and Scrutiny Committee to hear about and discuss this year's budget.

'Locally I have been in discussions to help resolve matters relating to:

highways

speeding traffic through our villages.

ditches and flooding

enforcement (Motel)'

Cllr Anthony asked what will happen about the Public conveniences that are to remain open. The Chairman said that things would carry on as normal.

In connection with the flooding, Cllr Rashleigh reported that the Trewithick Road flooding problem appeared to have been dealt with.

Cllr Wyvern Batt asked whether the Parishioner who had offered to pay for the cutting of the closed graveyards in Breage had been contacted.

Cllr Keeling had spoken to Lee Viners in regard to the signs at the Motel in Ashton and had asked that the posts be removed. It was asked if a place has to be booked for the Budget Meeting. Cllr Keeling said to just turn up or to let the Clerk know.

## 9. PLANNING

Cllr Keeling's statement: 'As a reserve member of the Planning West Committee I will not make a final decision on any planning matter until I have heard all the evidence and arguments'. Cllr Keeling advised that he would become a full member of the Planning Committee the week after next and would then need to change his statement. He would be taking the late Cllr Clayton's place.

Cllr Board knew that the premises had been there since the 1960s and it appeared as a building on the 1936 Ordnance Survey map. There used to be a notice there for knitted jumpers. Cllr Caddick recalled that it was a former miners' changing hut. **It was proposed by Cllr Board, seconded by Cllr Caddick and unanimously resolved to comment that Cllr Board knows that the building has been used as a residence since the 1960s.**

## 10. CONSULTATION ON PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE PRE-APPLICATION SERVICE

**A discussion on** how the Parish Council should proceed on this matter

Cllr Anthony had mixed feelings as she felt that not all relevant people would be consulted. She felt that the proposed site visit would be a step forward as at present advice was being given without site visits having taken place. She was also concerned about householder enquiries. The suggestion for neighbours to engage/consult with occupiers was felt to be good practice. Cllr Anthony said that if this had happened during the Sea Acres application it would have been less stressful for her and time and money would have been saved if a planning officer had visited Sea Acres before giving advice. She felt that non-householder planning applicants should also be encouraged to also consult with the community and the Parish Council. **It was proposed by Cllr Anthony, seconded by Cllr Keeling and unanimously resolved that non-householders also be encouraged to consult with the applicant and the community and the Parish Council.**

Cllr Anthony referred to page 2 under 'the benefits of pre-application enquiries and discussions include:' and felt that bullet point 6 should read: possibly securing the support from officers".

Cllr Keeling felt that that although there were still a few shades of grey, the 't's were being crossed and the 'i's dotted.

## 11. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING PROCESS

Cllr Anthony had sent through to Councillors a copy of her comments from the meeting of 3 October 2011. Councillors had also received a copy of the minutes of the meeting.

Cllr Anthony's report:

'I have circulated the information from the meeting held on 3 October 2011.

'Therefore, in summary, the Government and Cornwall Council want Parish and Town Councils (and later on neighbourhood forums or community rights groups to draw up Local Development Plans, which once approved will form part of the Statutory Development Plan for Cornwall and will be used to grant Local Development Orders and planning permission.

'I find the proposal alarming and a 'developers' charter' disguised as community involvement. This seems nothing more than a plan to get Parish and Town Councils to identify development areas for developers and Cornwall Council and to automatically enable development because the rules say that people can't say 'no' to development.

'It actually restricts people's views on their neighbourhood because the core of the plan is that it always has to be permissive - you can't say 'no' as can be seen from the Cornwall Council documentation.

'Having said this, the Bill is going to become law so I feel that we need to have a view as a Parish Council and decide how we are going to proceed.

'I don't think we are equipped to take on this role as we are not planning experts and Phil Mason admitted that councils would have to get professional advice when considering applications. We also do not have the funds or organisation to do it.

'However, before we are able to make any decisions we need more information and we have to know how Planning will operate in the absence of an LDP and how they will operate. In practice, Cornwall Council needs to formally confirm what policies/procedures will be in place for planning applications e.g. will the Planning Protocol remain because it has been confirmed that PPS's are going?

'I propose that we write to Phil Mason/Tom Flanagan to get this information so that we can make a decision on how we are going to proceed and that John Keeling, as Ward Councillor ensures that this is answered.'

After discussion it was proposed by Cllr Anthony, seconded by Cllr Keeling and unanimously resolved that information be requested from Phil Mason/Tom Flanagan. Cllr Keeling agreed to chase this up.

## 12. FINANCE

- a) To resolve to approve Finance Regulations 6.6 use of a variable DD for payments to SW Water for quarterly water payments for the Cemetery and Parish Rooms  
It was proposed by Cllr Shrimpton, seconded by Cllr Best and unanimously resolved to approve Finance Regulations 6.6 use of a variable DD for payments to SW Water for quarterly water payments for the Cemetery and Parish Rooms.
- b) To register in the Cornwall Council Preferential Payment Terms for Small & Medium Enterprise Suppliers  
The Clerk explained that Cornwall Council are now going to pay small suppliers as quickly as possible, in respect of Breage Parish Council this would be for LMP footpath cutting. The Council's interest would need to be registered. It was proposed by Cllr Best, seconded by Cllr Wyvern Batt and unanimously resolved that the Clerk register Breage Parish Council in the Cornwall Council Preferential Payment Terms for Small & Medium Enterprise Suppliers.
- c) To resolve to approve November payments  
Cllr Shrimpton confirmed that he had checked the payments.

It was proposed by Cllr Shrimpton, seconded by Cllr Keeling and unanimously resolved that the payments as listed above be passed for payment.

## 13. FOOTPATHS

Cllr Keeling asked Cllr Darby to arrange a meeting with Colin Bayes as he would like to enquire about refurbishing the path outside the toilets at Praa Sands. Cllr Darby asked if she should contact Colin Bayes or if Cllr Keeling could see him at the PAROW meeting on 16 November, rather than have a meeting. Cllr Keeling said that he would try to get to the meeting. Cllr Darby spoke about the LMP grant figures that Cllr Ackland had asked about at the last meeting. The figure for this year is £3,178 and the previous year it was £3,301 as an allowance had been made for additional work. This year, because of the increase in the Contractor's charges, £8.90 had been used over the grant amount.

Cllr Rashleigh asked that the Clerk notify Sithney Parish Council that there is a footpath sign that has fallen down near the Ivory Bistro.

Cllr Darby provided pictures of the unsafe structure at Keneggy Beach that is to be dismantled, (see Clerk's report and Cornwall Councillor's report). Hopefully the stainless steel will be recycled.

**14. HIGHWAYS**

Cllr Wyvern Batt expressed thanks to Cornwall Council for filling in the Godolphin potholes. However, there are 2 holes in Jew's Lane above the stream near Modder House.

Cllr Rashleigh said that there are still potholes near Mr Bowen's home in Breage.

The matter of a sign on Byway 47 re. car parking was raised again. The Clerk has requested this on more than one occasion but had not received a satisfactory reply.

**15. STREET LIGHTING**

**Non-routine repairs carried out on Streetlights 065BA, 085BA and 098BA**

An invoice for £2,754.40 has been received.

**16. CEMETERY/CLOSED GRAVEYARDS**

**To look at the possibilities for keeping tidy the Cremated Remains Memorial Garden in Breage Cemetery**

Cllr Shrimpton and Keeling pledged to voluntarily keep the area of the Cremated Remains memorial garden tidy. **It was proposed by Cllr Wyvern Batt, seconded by Cllr Keeling that Cllr Shrimpton be permitted to claim fuel expenses.**

**17. PRAA SANDS**

a) The possibility of a new bus shelter at Praa Sands

The triangular area that had been suggested had been looked into and it was felt to be a totally unsuitable site. Other sites would now be considered. **It was proposed by Cllr Keeling, seconded by Cllr Board and unanimously resolved that no bus shelter be erected in the triangular area at Praa Sands.**

b) Surf Lifesaving Event

The Clerk had received a request from Surf Lifesaving Cornwall asking for permission to use Praa Sands Beach on 11 and 12 August 2012 for an event. Whilst Council had no objections to the event taking place, **it was proposed by Cllr Keeling, seconded by Cllr Wyvern Batt and unanimously resolved that the Clerk ask for further details of the event from Surf Lifesaving Cornwall.** Cllr Anthony noted that this would be the busiest time of the holiday season. Cllr Board thought it would be very good to reintroduce the Surf Lifesaving activities to Praa Sands.

**18. AFFORDABLE HOMES**

Drop-in meeting to be held in Breage Village Hall Monday 14 November 2011 3-7 p.m. re. additional homes for St Breaca Close Breage

Cllr Rashleigh expressed her disappointment that Devon & Cornwall Housing had not met with the Parish Council prior to this drop-in session. The Chairman said that Councillors should attend the drop-in and see for themselves what DCH were suggesting for St Breaca Close and to say if they did not approve.

**19. RISK ASSESSMENT**

**To consider: Refresher fire extinguisher training**

The Clerk has made enquiries and it appears that training should be updated every two years by one person who could then pass the information on to others. Cost has been requested but not yet provided.

**Electrics regular checking**

It was agreed that the electrics should be checked once a year. **It was proposed by Cllr Keeling, seconded by Cllr Wyvern Batt and unanimously resolved that the electrics in the Parish Rooms be checked annually.**

**Meter in Toilet Room**

This passes H & S requirements as it is inside a cupboard. This has been confirmed by EDF.

**Provision of Disabled Toilet**

It was agreed that this is not possible in the Parish Room but was suggested that support handles be installed on both sides of the toilet. It was thought that The Queen's Arms may permit disabled attendees to use their disabled toilet facilities. **It was proposed by Cllr Keeling, seconded by Cllr Shrimpton and unanimously resolved that a letter be written to the Queen's Arms licensee to request permission for disabled attendees at the Parish Rooms to use the Queen's Arms disabled toilet should the need arise and that the Clerk obtain the correct sizing for support handles for the Parish Rooms toilet and have them fitted.**

**To approve and adopt the Sickness/absence of Clerk policy.**

**It was proposed by Cllr Wyvern Batt, seconded by Cllr Shrimpton and unanimously resolved that the Sickness/absence of Clerk policy be approved, adopted and signed.** The Chairman signed the policy.

**To approve monthly inspection of Village Greens by Councillors**

Cllr Rashleigh volunteered to check Breage Green, Cllrs Greenstreet and Wyvern Batt volunteered to check Godolphin Green and Cllrs Anthony and Board volunteered to check Praa Green. **It was proposed by Cllr Keeling, seconded by Cllr Shrimpton and unanimously resolved that the Village Greens be inspected monthly by the above named Councillors.**

**Ross Beard check safety playing field hedges**

**It was proposed by Cllr Keeling, seconded by Cllr Shrimpton and unanimously resolved that Mr Ross Beard be asked to check the playing field hedges for safety issues.**

**To approve and sign the amended Risk Assessment for 2011**

**It was proposed by Cllr Wyvern Batt, seconded by Cllr Shrimpton and unanimously resolved that the 2011 Risk Assessment be approved and signed.** The Chairman signed the Risk Assessment.

**20. SOLAR PANELS**

**To receive the report on the unsuitability of the Parish Rooms roof**

Mike Cooke from Plug into the Sun had visited the Parish Rooms and informed the Clerk that he felt it would be a waste of the Parish's money to install solar panels on the Parish Rooms' roof because it did not face in a suitable direction, the roof was small and sunlight would be blocked by the church tower.

**21. HELSTON & THE LIZARD PENINSULA COMMUNITY NETWORK**

Report on Panel meeting 26<sup>th</sup> October 2011

Cllr Greenstreet gave the following report:

'I attended a meeting of the **Helston & Lizard Peninsula Community Network Panel** on Wednesday 26th October, at Isaac House, 7pm, Chairman - Cllr Andrew Wallace.

'First item on the agenda was the Transport project (Colin Garrick/Charlotte Chadwick)

'Main concerns were for young people being able to access events in towns, when they live in rural areas. Suggestions as follows: Penhallow - electric bikes, possible extending of Dial-a-Ride, Local car share, Community Taxi, borrowing any mini-vans when not in use by owners, even horse-drawn taxi's were mentioned!!!

'Comments: cost of school bus fare, could this be subsidised and also be used in the evenings, - one night a week?

'An affordable Bid - questionnaire to go to Parish Councils for comments - bus companies and schools to be contacted.

'Also suggested community based bikes.

'A focus group could be formed in schools - Helston Deputy Head expressed an interest.

'Sue Swift mentioned that older people have similar problems

'Also mentioned the difficulty of getting a hospital car.

**' Helston Museum - accredited Museum Status in 2011**

'The only one directly run by Cornwall Council, employing an Operations. Manager, 2 part-time assistants, one seasonal assistant and 4 volunteers.

'Open 3hours x 6 days per week.

'Cornwall Council not ideal to run Museum but give some £47,000 pa. The only museum in Cornwall to be directly supported, and funding in place for next year.

'Name - Helston Folk Museum - now being reconsidered, as it is not only for Helston but surrounding area.

'Funding from precepts considered?

'Possible Trust/social Enterprise to run?

'Considered the gateway to Heritage site?, community shares? , present opening times - considered limiting.

'Meeting on 7th December to target History Societies, attract volunteers, etc. Posters to come.

'Important item should not to be rushed through.

**'Next Meeting** - Agenda - Toilets and Youth facilities for rural areas (Youth Bus?)

'Committee agreed that Charlotte Chadwick draft a "good strong letter from the Panel" to Cornwall Council about staying the decision to close toilets.

'**Police** spoke about the changes to structure mainly geographical. There were 12 Sections, now there are 6, reducing police by 700 to 2015. £50M has to be saved. Officers to leave after 30 years service. 101 now the new number to call (15p per call) though previous number will remain in place for a year.

'**Time**, date and venue of next meeting to be arranged - but agreed that Isaac House good venue for most people.'

The Chairman expressed the Council's thanks to Cllr Greenstreet for attending the meeting and supplying the report.

**22. CHRISTMAS MEAL**

Friday 16 December 2011 at 6.00 p.m. in the Lion and Lamb, Ashton

The Clerk asked for menus and deposits to be passed to her as soon as possible.

**23. REPORT FROM CLERK**

- a) The Clerk had received a letter from David Attwell about the outcome of the beach access and steps at Keneggy Sands. The Letter was read out. The conclusion being that the steps be removed as soon as possible. A temporary closure is in place to beach access. The Parish Council will be contacted with any future suggestions. Any observations would be welcomed.
- b) The Clerk informed Cllrs Keeling and Wyvern Batt that the poppy wreaths were in the Parish Rooms, ready for their collections.
- c) The Clerk had heard from Cpt Williamson at Cudrose that Lt Cdr Suckling would lay a poppy wreath at Godolphin on Remembrance Sunday.
- d) The Bylaws sign at Praa Sands has been moved as per Council
- e) The Clerk had written to the late Cllr Clayton's family expressing the Parish Council's condolences.
- f) The Clerk had received official confirmation that the Parish Rooms is not a grade II listed building.

**24. MEMBERS' REPORTS TO THE COUNCIL AND REPORTS FROM OUTSIDE BODIES**Carleen Village Hall

Cllr Darby reported that there will be a Flea Market next Saturday and a Quiz Night on the third Saturday.

On 11 December Stithians Choir would be singing.

Cllr Rashleigh reported that the hole in the footway next to Cardueville, Higher Road, Breage had still not been repaired.

Cllr Greenstreet reported that Godolphin closed churchyard was still a mess.

Cllr Anthony asked about Cllr Keeling's meeting with Haulfryn. Cllr Keeling advised that Haulfryn do not wish to meet with him. Chris Daley may be willing to come to a Parish Council meeting. The alternative would be for the Parish Council to put in an official complaint.

The meeting she had attended at Praa Green with Cllrs Keeling and Board had been useful.

Where folk are making their own path there is visible breaking up on the dunes. Decent signage would encourage folk to use the correct path

Cllr Board spoke about the SW Coastal footpath and wondered if Highways would provide signs.

Cllr Keeling agreed that the fencing at the Green steps needs sorting. He will see if Cllrs Board, Anthony and himself can meet with Steve Schotel.

Cllr Board reported that the weekend before last there had been a tent on the Green and a fire. She had called 101 and the Police attended. She had cleared the detritus – burnt bottles, cans and nails. She felt that there needs to be a short notice that simply says No Camping No Fires.

She reported that the rabbit holes have still not been filled.

Cllr Greenstreet reported that the old metal that had been left on Tremeane Beach had now been removed.

Cllr Caddick reported that since the National Trust took over Godolphin House any papers pre 1900 have been removed to the Records Office. He wondered if any others in private hands should also be moved.
